1. To meet the needs of Hertfordshire's children within their local community.

School Improvement Strategy

What We Want To Achieve

The vision is that 'every child in Hertfordshire will attend a great school where they are safe and happy and enabled to reach their full potential'.

This will be done through improving the attainment and progress of all pupils, but especially disadvantaged pupils, and closing the gap between underachieving groups and all children and young people in Hertfordshire.

All schools have an important role to play with their pupil and parent communities in helping the move to Net Zero Carbon, as well as in their and Hertfordshire County Council's (HCC) responsibilities for school buildings and operations. HCC, working with schools, will deliver multiple programmes of work to support in the delivery of the council net zero carbon target across our school's portfolio, in line with the Sustainable Hertfordshire Strategy and the Council's priority for a cleaner greener environment.

Ensuring the right children are in Care

What We Want To Achieve

Ensure healthy fulfilling lives and improved outcomes for Hertfordshire's children in care and children on the edge of care:

- Ensuring children do not come into care unless absolutely necessary;
- Enabling children to leave care as soon as possible;
- Ensuring the right children are in the right type of placement, locally wherever possible, to meet their needs, at the right time.

School Place Planning Strategy

What We Want To Achieve

To meet the demands and changing needs of school setting provision across the county by developing new provision aligned to the SEND Strategy for developing specialist provision as well as support for SEND in mainstream schools.

What We Want To Achieve

To work with Health providers to ensure that the needs of children and young people are met by timely assessment and intervention through a model of prevention, early intervention and a trauma informed therapeutic approach to service delivery.

What We Want To Achieve

- To embed a joined-up continuum of support across early help and specialist services, ensuring that children and families get help early if or before problems escalate.
- To provide a more integrated Children's Services' front door to ensure requests for support or advice (contacts) are effectively triaged and families and partners receive the right advice and support as quickly as possible.
- To ensure Care Leavers are able to develop positive relationships and receive the support they need

SEND Strategy Programme - Phase 2

What We Want To Achieve

Continue to transform services for children and young people with SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disability) and families so that they are responsive, caring, joined up, inclusive and close to home; easy to access and maximise the benefits of digital technology; and better prepare young people for adulthood through improved access to independent living, employment and training.


Commissioning for the future

- Work with further education partners to help young people, and care leavers in particular, to gain in-demand skills and open up further job opportunities;
- Providing information, advice, guidance and careers education, including on the green economy, for young people to take advantage of new environmental career opportunities;
- Enable employers and businesses to collaborate and invest in skills of the future and to build their future workforce.

Lead a child-centred programme of recovery to help children and their families to recover from the longer term impacts of the COVID pandemic and live healthy and fulfilling lives.

To embed a trauma-informed approach in all schools, especially for those with additional vulnerabilities including Children Looked After and those known to Children's Services, to drive up attendance and achievements including further education and training.

What We Want To Achieve

To actively promote Diversity, Equality, Equity & Inclusion within the Children's Services' workforce and the communities it serves through identified work streams that link to HCC's Diversity & Inclusion Strategy. We will also commit to listening and responding to the voices of children, young people and families as well as our employees. We have now published our action plan, and will start working on the actions that will bring about positive change where it is needed.

A fully staffed service with a diverse and skilled workforce committed to improving outcomes for children and a cleaner, greener and healthier Hertfordshire

What We Want To Achieve

Continue to develop and implement the comprehensive induction offer for all new starters who take up a post every year in Children's Services so that they settle well and quickly and efficiently develop the knowledge and skills required for their new role. There will also be a focus on recruitment, and promoting Hertfordshire Children's Services as an inclusive place to work and great place to do social work.

Become a centre of excellence for professional development including leadership

What We Want To Achieve

Continue professional development in models of practice including Family Safeguarding and

trauma informed practice and training of Education Psychologists; and as a training centre in partnership with Front Line and the universities of Hertfordshire and Bedfordshire.

What We Want To Achieve

Move to a 'flexible & balanced' way that Children's Services' staff use offices in the future. Our Way Forward will provide a balance between meeting service and individual needs to support children and young people in Hertfordshire, underpinned by staff empowerment, wellbeing and trust.

5. To work in partnership to deliver early help and support to children, young people and families and prevent them from living in poverty

Building Stronger Families

What We Want To Achieve

To embed a strong and proactive continuum of support across Early Help and Family Safeguarding, providing multi-agency support to children and their families who are at risk of poor outcomes to prevent problems occurring, and to tackle them before they get worse and prevent escalation into safeguarding services.

Hertfordshire Safeguarding Children Partnership (HSCP)

What We Want To Achieve

We will continue to support and work on HSCP current priorities which are:

- Adolescents Tackling risks to adolescents and support in their recovery
- Neglect Ensure that the issues of neglect receive due prominence in early identification, assessment, prevention and intervention particularly in relation to Domestic Abuse, parental mental health and substance misuse
- Continuous Learning and Improvement Responding to local and national learning and ensuring appropriate scrutiny of safeguarding arrangements through audit and other quality assurance activity.

Serious Violence Strategy, Youth Justice Plan and Contextual Safeguarding

What We Want To Achieve

Reduce the risk of experiencing serious violence and child exploitation amongst Hertfordshire's young people by working in partnership to continue to develop and improve intelligence sharing to meet the evolving needs and increase in demand for services; including a focus on prevention of adolescents coming into care and the youth justice system by building resilience in families and community services.

What We Want To Achieve

To embed a partnership programme to address the economic and health challenges created by the COVID pandemic and its impact over the next few years, focused on 4 key themes:

- A good start in life including early years and early intervention.
- Education and skills including lifelong learning.

- · Crisis and immediate support for residents
- Food insecurity
